INTRODUCTION

KPMG Accounting Scholarship for students from Black, Indigenous and racialized communities

PURPOSE OF FUND

To award scholarships to students who are part of a Black, Indigenous and/or racialized community, who are enrolled in second year of the BCom in Accounting program and have demonstrated academic excellence.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student;
2. be enrolled full-time in second year of the BCom in Accounting program at the Telfer School of Management of the University of Ottawa;
3. demonstrate academic excellence; and
4. self-identify as a racialized person (member of a visible minority), that is, a non-Indigenous, non-white person, regardless of place of birth or citizenship;

OR

provide documented proof of Indigenous identity, in accordance with the requirements of the University of Ottawa Eligibility for Focused Admissions, Scholarships, and Bursaries for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis People administrative procedure.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE
