PAUL-NORMAND DUSSAULT COMMEMORATIVE GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

INTRODUCTION

Paul-Normand Dussault was a professor of Political Science at the University of Ottawa. His teaching and research focussed on international relations and international development. He was particularly interested in Africa, on which he was an acknowledged expert, and in issues of equity, social justice and economic transformation.

Paul-Normand Dussault left his mark on several generations of students with his desire to introduce them to intellectual reflection and his passion for communicating his knowledge.

During his long career, he was a visiting scholar to the International Institute for Labour Studies of the International Labour Organization (ILO). A strong supporter of the United Nations, he was active within UNESCO. In addition to his work as a professor, Paul-Normand Dussault devoted a great deal of energy to promoting the career of academia within the APUO and as a union negotiator.

His friends, family and colleagues are pleased to honour his memory at the University of Ottawa by creating a scholarship fund intended principally for students who are pursuing interests in the field of international development that was cherished by Paul-Normand Dussault.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To award a scholarship to a student in the French-language Master's in Globalization and International Development program, who wishes to expand their knowledge of international development by participating in a course or an internship abroad.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must:

1. be registered as a full-time student in the French-language Master's in Globalization and International Development program at the Faculty of Social Sciences;
2. be in good academic standing;
3. display an interest in expanding their knowledge in international development; and
4. take part in a field-research course or in an international internship offered by the Faculty of Social Sciences. The course or internship must be approved by the applicant's academic unit and the International Office.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through the uoZone portal, and should include:

1. proof of registration in a course or an internship abroad, as approved by the applicant's academic unit and the International Office; and
2. a one-page text describing the objectives pursued during the course or internship abroad. The student may re-use the information included in their application for the course or internship to produce this text.

Note: Upon returning from the course or internship abroad, the recipient must present a two-to-four-page report to the donor, describing the objectives pursued and the knowledge acquired.
