Paul-Normand Dussault Memorial Master's Scholarship

INTRODUCTION

Paul-Normand Dussault was a professor of political science at the University of Ottawa. His teaching and research dealt with international relations and international development. He was particularly interested in Africa (on which he was a recognized expert) and in questions of equity, social justice and economic adjustment.

Paul-Normand Dussault touched many generations of students with his passion for sharing his knowledge and desire to introduce them to intellectual inquiry.

Over his long career, he was a guest researcher at the International Institute for Labour Studies of the International Labour Organization and was active in UN and UNESCO circles. In addition to his work as a professor, Paul-Normand Dussault devoted much energy to promoting careers in academia within the APUO and to being a union negotiator.

His friends, family and colleagues are pleased to honour his memory at the University of Ottawa by establishing a Paul-Normand Dussault scholarship fund dedicated to students pursuing the interests dear to Paul-Normand Dussault in the area of international development.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To award a scholarship in support of students enrolled in the French-language master's in international development and globalization wishing to enhance their knowledge of international development by completing a course or placement abroad.

AWARD DETAILS

Eligibility

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student.
- Be enrolled as a full-time student in the French-language master's in international development at the Faculty of Social Sciences.
- Be in good academic standing.
- Demonstrate an interest in improving their knowledge of international development.
- Participate in a field research course or international placement offered by the Faculty of Social Sciences. The course or placement must have been approved by the applicant's academic unit and by uoInternational.

APPLICATIONS

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through uoZone. They must include the following:

- documents confirming the applicant's participation in a course or placement abroad
- a text (max. 500 words) describing the applicant's goals in participating in a course or placement abroad (Applicants can re-use information in their course or placement application to create this text.)

Note: Recipients must provide the donor with a written report of two to four pages describing the goals they sought to meet and knowledge gained on their return from the course or placement abroad.
