André Dabrowski Scholarship Fund

INTRODUCTION

This fund was created by family, friends and colleagues in memory of Dr. André Robert Dabrowski who passed away in October 2006 following a short and courageous battle with cancer.

Professor Dabrowski's career spanned more than 20 years at the University, where he was professor of Mathematics and held various administrative positions. An extensively published professor and researcher, he was an alumnus of the University, receiving a Bachelor's in Science in 1977 and his Master's in Science in 1978. He also received a PhD from the University of Illinois (Urbana). From 1993 to 1995, he served as Director of the Ottawa-Carleton Institute of Mathematics and Statistics. Professor Dabrowski taught at the University of Ottawa since 1990. He became Vice-Dean, Research, Faculty of Science and was appointed Dean of the Faculty of Science in June 2006. His devotion to learning and innovation will be remembered by his colleagues and students.
