BERNADETTE SARAZIN AND CARL NAPPERT ADMISSION SCHOLARSHIP

INTRODUCTION

This scholarship was generously created in honour of Bernadette Sarazin and Carl Nappert.

Since joining Maplesoft Group in 2001, Carl Nappert's (BCom '97) sales and strategic leadership has been instrumental in redefining the vision of the business as well as the strategic direction, including assessing the company's current market opportunities, competitive positioning, areas of expertise, mix of service offerings and solutions in order to determine the appropriate strategic roadmap for Maplesoft. While earning his BCom with specializations in marketing and international business from the University of Ottawa, Nappert served as president of the student association and took first place in the entrepreneurship case test at the Jeux du commerce. He received the Ottawa Business Journal's 40 under 40 Award, which recognizes business executives who balance bottom-line results with participation in charitable and community activities. He also received the 2010 Young Achiever's Award from the Telfer School of Management, which recognizes alumni who have achieved business excellence before age 40.

Bernadette Sarazin (BCom '98) has more than 20 years of experience in strategic planning, project management, governance, communications and marketing. In 2020, she graduated with a Master's Degree in Law (LLM) with a specialization in Privacy and Cybersecurity. Sarazin supports organizations in achieving compliance to different privacy laws (GDPR, PIPEDA) and specializes in the protection of privacy and personal data. In conjunction and since 2009, a seasoned businesswoman, Bernadette was the recipient of the *Ordre de la Pléiade* Medal presented by the Ontario Branch of the *Assemblée parlementaire de la Francophonie* (APF) (2018); the *Ordre* recognizes exceptional contributions to the Francophonie in Ontario. She was recognized as *Citizen of the Year* during the Bernard Grandmaitre Gala (ACFO Ottawa) and *Personality of the Year* during the Saphir Gala of the Franco-Ontarian Foundation. While earning her BCom with a specialization in marketing and in finance at the University of Ottawa, Sarazin created ELLE, an Entrepreneurs Club gala to highlight women's business accomplishments. In 2022, the gala marked its 25th edition.

Nappert and Sarazin met during their studies at the Telfer School of Management. Over the past 20 years, they have been very active in their community. Nappert is chair of the Montfort Hospital Board of Administration and is ex-patron of the Gala des Grands Chefs in support of the Canadian Cancer Society. He is also a member of the Telfer School of Management Advisory Board and has donated generously to the Maplesoft Cancer Centre in Ottawa. Sarazin was Chair of the Regroupement des dens d'affaires de la capitale nationale (RGA0), vice-president of Unique FM 94.5 and a spokesperson for the #BilingualOttawa initiative. As a couple with three children (Théa, Ana and Cam), they enjoy spending time as a family while travelling, boating, skiing and playing all sorts of games and sports.
