PURPOSE OF FUND

To support Indigenous students, members of racialized communities or female students enrolled in the Faculty of Engineering.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility criteria

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or a person with protected or refugee status.
2. Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Ottawa.
3. Be in good academic standing.
4. Demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa.
5. Be an Indigenous student;

or

Identify as a racialized person (member of a visible minority) defined as a person other than Indigenous (Aboriginal), who is non-white in colour or race, regardless of place of birth or citizenship;

or

Be a female student.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through uoZone. They should include the following:

1. The Financial Questionnaire; and
2. At least one of the following:
 - a. documented proof of Indigenous identity, in accordance with the requirements of the [University of Ottawa Eligibility for Focused Admissions, Scholarships, and Bursaries for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis People administrative procedure](#);
 - b. self-identification from the applicant who identifies as a member of a racialized community as per the [Ontario Human Rights Commission policy and guidelines on racism and racial discrimination](#) section 2.1 ("Race' — A social construct");
 - c. confirmation from the applicant who identifies as a female student.
