INTRODUCTION

Kim Vallières (BCom '17 Finance) is a fast rising, Montreal-based professional working in risk management and insurance brokerage.

Applicants must:

- 1. Be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student;
- 2. Be a woman;
- Be registered as a full-time student at the Telfer School of Management of the University of Ottawa;
- 4. Demonstrate financial need, according to the criteria of the University of Ottawa Financial Aid and Awards Service; and
- 5. Be a racialized person (member of a visible minority), meaning a person other than an Indigenous person who is non-white in colour or race, regardless of place of birth orcitizenship.

Value of the award: Minimum \$1,000

Number of awards: Minimum of two

Frequency of the award: Annual

Level or program of study: Undergraduate
