Jean Pierre Martin Memorial Scholarship

INTRODUCTION

This scholarship was generously created to honour the life of Jean Pierre Martin. After graduating with the electrical engineering class of 1968 and working 25 years as a professional engineer, Jean pivoted to inventing fall protection equipment. He dedicated the next 30 years of his career to training people around the world in the use of safety equipment when working from great heights on construction sites and in mines, as well as instructing the distributors who sold such equipment. He was recognized as a leader in the industry.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To support undergraduate students enrolled in the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Ottawa who are members of a Black community or Indigenous students.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility criteria

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student.
- Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Ottawa.
- Demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa.
- Be a member of a Black community.

OR

Provide documented proof of Indigenous identity, in accordance with the requirements of the University of Ottawa Eligibility for Focused Admissions, Scholarships and Bursaries for First Nations, Inuit and Métis People administrative procedure.
