INTRODUCTION

This scholarship was created by Jacques Vaillancourt (BCom '68), president of Forest City Services Inc., a company based in the state of Oregon. PURPOSE OF FUND

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

- 1. Be enrolled in second, third or fourth year of a Telfer French-language BCom program;
- 2. Be an Ontario resident as per OSAP (Ontario Student Assistance Program) regulations;
- 3. Demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa;
- 4. Have achieved an annual GPA of 7.0;
- 5. Be taking at least three courses in French at the time of application; and
- 6. Demonstrate leadership qualities and be involved in student affairs.

Value of award: Minimum of \$1.500

Number of awards: Minimum of 2

Frequency of the award: Annual

Program or level of study: Undergraduate
