NAME OF ENDOWMENT FUND (OTSS¹)

Guy Huot Memorial Scholarship

INTRODUCTION

The fund was established in memory of Guy Huot (BA'64) by friends and family. Guy Huot passed away in Paris on June 9, 2002 of a brain haemorrhage. In the 1960s, Mr. Huot worked as an organist for several Ottawa churches and was also a freelance music critic for *LeDroit*. From 1966 to 1973, he was head of music at the Canada Council and then spent two years as music administrator at the National Arts Centre Orchestra, responsible for the orchestra both at home and on tour. He was secretary general for the Canadian Music Council from 1976 to 1987. Mr. Huot also served on the boards of several organizations, including the Ottawa Choral Society. He moved to Paris in 1987 as executive secretary of the International Music Council and three years later was appointed secretary general. He was also the Paris correspondent for *Opera Canada* magazine.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To provide financial assistance to deserving students registered in the Bachelor in Music (BMus) program at the School of Music, Faculty of Arts of the University of Ottawa.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must:

1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or a person with the protected/refugee status;
2. be registered full-time in the Bachelor of Music (BMus) program at the School of Music, Faculty of Arts of the University of Ottawa. Students in a BMus combined program are not eligible;
3. be an Ontario resident, as per OSAP² rules;
4. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa; and
5. demonstrate academic and performance excellence.

Value of the Award: Minimum \$500

Number of Awards: Variable

Frequency of the Award: Annual

Level of the Award: Undergraduate
