# **Marcel Hamelin Common Law Entrance Scholarships**

## INTRODUCTION

This fund was established in 2001 by the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section, as a tribute to former University of Ottawa Rector and Vice-Chancellor, Marcel Hamelin. Dr. Hamelin served in this capacity from 1990-2001 after having dedicated the previous 16 years of his professional career to his role as Dean of the Faculty of Arts. Dr. Hamelin is a renowned historian, a respected University administrator and a friend of the Faculty of Law.

# **PURPOSE OF FUND**

Provide scholarships annually to students entering their first year of the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section.

### **SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS**

# **Eligibility Criteria**

The applicant must:

- 1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with the protected/refugee status or an international student;
- 2. be admitted and registered full-time in the first year of the JD English-language or French-language program at the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Law, Common Law Section;
- 3. have achieved excellent academic standing at the undergraduate university level; and
- 4. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa.

Value of the award: \$5,000

Number of awards: Variable (at least one to a student entering the JD English-language program, and at

least one to a student entering the JD French-language program)

Frequency of the award: Annual

Level or program of study: Undergraduate

Renewable: Yes, for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year, provided that the recipient maintains a minimum CGPA of 6.0
