#### PURPOSE OF FUND

To award a scholarship to a Black student newly admitted to the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section, who is involved in a Black community.

# SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

#### Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must:

- 1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with the protected/refugee status or an international student;
- 2. be admitted as a full-time first year student in the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section, of the University of Ottawa;
- 3. self-identify as a member of a Black community;
- 4. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa; and
- 5. demonstrate involvement in a Black community.
