Bereskin & Parr Admission Scholarship (Civil Law)

Introduction

This scholarship was generously created by Bereskin & Parr LLP.

Purpose of fund

To award an admission scholarship to an undergraduate student and member of a racialized or Indigenous community entering first year at the Faculty of Law, Civil Law Section.

Scholarship details

Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must:

1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student;
2. be admitted as a full-time student to first year at the Faculty of Law, Civil Law Section, of the University of Ottawa;
3. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa; and
4. be a racialized person (member of a visible minority), defined as a person other than Indigenous (Aboriginal), who is non-white in colour or race, regardless of place of birth or citizenship;

OR

provide documented proof of Indigenous identity, in accordance with the requirements of the University of Ottawa Eligibility for Focused Admissions, Scholarships, and Bursaries for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis People administrative procedure.

Application procedure

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through uoZone, and should include:

1. the Financial Questionnaire; and
2. documented proof of Indigenous identity, in accordance with the requirements of the University of Ottawa Eligibility for Focused Admissions, Scholarships, and Bursaries for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis People administrative procedure;

OR

self-identification from the applicant who identifies as a member of a racialized community as per the [Ontario Human Rights Commission policy and guidelines on racism and racial discrimination section 2.1 \("Race" — A social construct\)](#).
