Tsampalieros Family Entrance Scholarship

INTRODUCTION

This scholarship was created by Gabriel Tsampalieros, graduate of the Common Law Class of 1973, in memory of his father, Theodosios Tsampalieros (1911-1974). Theodosios Tsampalieros left his village on Rhodes Island, Greece, in 1951 to move to Montreal. He was an entrepreneur in the truest sense. He was a risk taker. He took a risk on vision. He loved this country and he saw the opportunities it offered to those who came to Canada. This scholarship was established in order to commemorate his father's entrepreneurial spirit.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To provide financial support to qualified students entering the first year of the JD Program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section of the University of Ottawa. In particular, this scholarship is intended to assist students who, without a scholarship of this magnitude, might be precluded altogether from attending law school.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must:

- 1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or a person with the protected/refugee status;
- 2. be an Ontario resident, as per OSAP² rules;
- 3. have been admitted into the first year of the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section of the University of Ottawa; and
- 4. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa.
