PURPOSE OF FUND

Financially support a student registered in the second or third year of the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section who demonstrates both academic excellence and financial need.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

The candidate must:

1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with the protected/refugee status or an international student;
2. be registered as a full-time or a part-time student in the second or third year of the JD program at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section of the University of Ottawa;
3. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa; and
4. demonstrate academic excellence.

Value of the award: Minimum \$1,000

Number of awards: Variable

Frequency of the award: Annual

Level or program of study: Undergraduate

Application deadline: October 31

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through uoZone, and should include the Financial Questionnaire.

NOTE

To be considered for this scholarship, you must apply through the Financial Need Bursaries - Common Law Section (99929).

In the case of multiple candidates meeting the base requirements, the selection committee will select the recipient based on the award policies and standard criteria used by the Common Law Section at the time of selection.
