

James Douglas Hearnshaw Memorial Bursary

INTRODUCTION

This fund was created in 2012 through a bequest from James Douglas Hearnshaw. He was born in England in 1922 and came to Canada in 1951. In addition to having a distinguished career as a naval architect and chief designer, becoming a life member of the Royal Institute of Naval Architects, he was also a professional engineer. Following his retirement from Transport Canada in 1988, he studied psychology at the University of Ottawa, obtaining a BA in 1992 (concentration) and 1996 (honours). Described by friends as a “Renaissance man” he had an endless curiosity and a belief in learning all of his life. After retiring from naval architecture and engineering, he pursued a wide variety of interests such as music, woodworking and carving, calligraphy, mentoring students and even fortune telling.
